

## Sports Premium Grant 2021-2022

Physical Education and school sports are incredibly important to us at Westley Middle School. The P.E and School Sport Premium Fund from the government has been greatly received and is vital to how we can progress further with our sports education. We plan to use the funds wisely to further the children's love of sports and to help them develop skills that they will use for the rest of their lives. Within the school we have an action plan outlining how we wish to use the money, baseline data we are collecting and evidence to show the positive impact of the funding. To impact on the attainment and progress of pupils and offer sustained improvement in the provision of P.E and Sports at Westley, we plan to spend the money in the following areas.

How do we plan to spend the money?

1. To provide transport to & from out of school sporting events, including swimming (Sept - Dec).
2. To provide swimming lessons for year 5.
3. Having been hugely successful in the previous year - an additional coach to allow lessons to be split and taught in smaller groups. As part of the agreement to hire Miss Brawn she will run five (high quality) Sports Clubs before/after school for free. These clubs are available to all students regardless of their ability in sport.
4. Entry to the school's football tournament Entering into various sports competitions
5. Buying new sports equipment for PE lessons and clubs

### Impact of past Sports Funding 2020-2021

This year, we have used a large chunk of the PE budget to bring in a high sports coach to work alongside the class teacher. Jo Brawn, who has a degree (Bsc Sport, health and exercise) and is a level 2 Basketball coach has fantastic knowledge with a variety of sports and is also teaching her own lessons in one of the Trust's Primary schools.

This has been a great expenditure, not only has it benefited the teachers (allowing the class to be split into smaller groups, with a qualified coach working with both groups) but it has also helped develop the children's understanding and has developed their confidence in PE. Coach Brawn also works alongside the PE staff to provide 10 lunchtime clubs throughout the week, which are free to join, and work on a turn up and play basis. Through these clubs we have seen lots more sports involvement and uptake of sports from children who would not normally take part in after-school clubs.

On top of the lunch time clubs, the school offers 6 before and after school clubs, giving our pupils a great opportunity of playing a variety of sports at all different levels.

We have purchased new equipment including mini tennis nets, stop watches and compasses to be used in OAA lessons (Outdoor Adventure Activities) .

We have also entered local competitions in multiple sports, to which we compete at a very high standard.

Part of the money received is used to employ extra MDSA's who can offer the use of our Activity Club - which has various sporting equipment for children to borrow and use at lunch to play independent sports.

I would say that this year we have used the PE budget to great effect and have created an incredibly healthy attitude towards physical exercise and sports across the whole entire school.
